


Figure 7: Registration Detail




Figure 3: Chief Guest Mr. Dipuk Lugdhir, Ex. Regional Officer, CED, GUJARAT.




Session 1: Dr. Vimal Kumar (Principal and Dean, ITM school of Pharmacy, Vacodara)




Figure 5 Session by Dr. Prafiil Bharadia Timing, 11:00 am -12:00pm Day 1(09:04/2021)




(Figure 6. Session by Dr. Nisith Patel




Figure 7 Session by Mr. Amit Patel Timing. 10:00am -11:00am Day 2(10:04/2021)




Figure 8 Session by Dr.Nirav Majmudar Timing:11:00am-12:00pm Day 2(10:04/2021)




Figure 10: Response from participants about E-Semmar.

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

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### Technical Sessions of Seminar

#### Technical Session 1:

Talk on "Current requirements and challenges in regulatory toxicology" was given by Dr. S. Rajesh Sundar, Vice President, Zydus Research Centre (Cadila Healthcare), Ahmedabad. He gave an detailed lecture on product specific regulatory requirements for toxicological studies. Macro ideas & minute details of toxicological studies to be carried out during New Chemical Entity (NCE) development was explained well.

Starting from basic understanding of toxicology, he covered different topics like, off target profiling, role of ADMC information in toxicology & exploratory toxicology. He also thoroughly explained regulatory requirements for toxicology in India, USFDA, EMA, OECD & ICH alongwith toxicological requirements for excipients, medical devices & genetic toxicology.

Dr. Sundar focused on practical approaches and observations to be carried out during toxicological experiments. The concept of NOEL, LOEL, LOAEL & FEL was explained alongwith clinical and brochemical markers. At the end of talk, Dr. Arindam Paul, Principal of college felicitated Dr. S. Rajicsh Sundar with a memento and certificate.





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#### **Technical Session 2:**

Mr. Vishwanath Pawar delivered a talk on "safety pharmacological evaluation of NMEs. Core battery and new initiatives. The main focus was on safety pharmacology. His talk was on various detailed aspects of safety pharmacology such as its importance and purpose and how it is important in relation to toxicology? The safety guidelines was described under various sections of ICH were covered and explained in detail especially ICH S7A guidelines with described core battery studies, core battery parameters and measurement techniques involving effects on major body systems (i.e., CNS, CVS and Respiratory system).

Description was given of general considerations for selection and design of safety studies with considerations of test systems like pharmacodynamic responsiveness of model, pharmacokinetic

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and other parameters of drugs/test substances, animal studies, ex vivo and in vitro systems with its inclusion of various studies (i.e., isolated organs, cell culture, receptors etc.).

He also focused on GLP requirements for safety pharmacology to be done in accordance with OECD GLP principles. Also covered ICH- S7A & ICH- E14 guidelines in which following points were discussed (a) non-clinical testing strategy for assessing the potentials of test substance to delay ventricular repolarisation. (b) In-vitro I<sub>c</sub> assay and in-vivo QT assay (involvement of electrophysiology toxicity study), (c) HERG safety margin for low risk of pro-arrhythmia.

The brief explanation on CIPA (Comprehensive in-vitro pro-armythmia assay) and MICE (multiple ion channel evaluation) was given by him. Another safe mechanism/ study system explained was "in-silico mechanistic computational modelling", with its advantage over clinical studies and in-vitro studies which contained risk in human stem cells and on electrophysiology. Interpretation of ECG with illustrative examples was also shown and explained. At the end of talk, Dr., Anker Merze, Associate Professor felicitated Mr. Vishwanath Pawar with a memento and certificate.

#### Technical Session 3:

A talk on "Genotoxic impurities in pharmaceutical drugs" was delivered by Dr. Ravi Yadav, Sr. Manager, Analytical Development Lab, Cola Ltd., Mumbai He covered the whole ICH guideline with special emphasis in impurity guidelines Q3-A to D. Impact of genotoxic impurities was explained in very nice manner alongwith case studies such as "How sometimes normal exciplent can be converted into genotoxic impurity and hence being the reason for BATCH RECALL. He also covered the various guidelines that are followed throughout the world for impurity testing. He emphasized and experienced that UK guidelines specify each perspective for impurity profiling in a very specific manner.

the mainty focused on the specific and sensitive analytical techniques such as HPLC, GC, LOMS, GCMS, ion chromatography along with their LOQ levels that are used for impurities profiling. Importance of sensitive methods in case of impurity profiling was covered in very much detail along with CASE STUDY & USP limits. Overall lecture was quite informative and presented detailed description about appropriate preformulation study as well as importance of developing sensitive and specific analytical methods to prevent future threats and financial loss in pharmaceutical industries. At the end of talk, Mr. Tularam Barot, Assistant Professor felicitated Dr. Ravi Yadav with a memento and certificate.





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#### Technical Session 4:

Lecture on "Toxicological manifestations due to polypharmacy secondary to multiple consultations" was delivered by Dr. Sunii Deshpande, a famous and experienced dermatologist among valsad District. He discussed all his experiences with us in form of pictorial representations, along with prescriptions. He insisted for a joint effort of physicians and pharmacists together for better treatment of patients and to prevent side effects or drug-drug interactions.

He discussed on how the polypharmacy due to multiple consultations are hazardous. It is not only hazardous but sometimes lethal. He advised to keep personal medical history file in very concise form to prevent from such serious side effects as well as to prevent allergic conditions. Drug-drug interactions are mainly seen on the surface of body and that is why it is misinterpreted as sion infections. So, he also explained various risk factors behind self-medication based on previous historical data.

He discussed ideal ways to write the prescription and also about the seriousness about the polypnarmacy. Lastly, one nice initiative taken by him was "SHOULD I DEPRESCRIBE?" and motivate pharmacists to startup such campaign combined with doctors for the betterment of society. 






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#### C. Valedictory Function:





#### REPORT ON GUEST / EXTESION LECTURE

Title of Guest Lecture: HPLC Method Development and Troubleshooting

Speaker: Dr. Sonal Desai, Associate Professor, SSR College of Pharmacy, Silvassa.

Date & Venue: 18th October 2016, Classroom No. 1

Event Coordinator: Dr. Arindam Paul, Professor & Principal

Dr. Sonal Desai gave information about general principles of HPLC. Application of HPLC and different types of HPLC techniques. She discussed various key features to be focused while development of HPLC method. She explained various chromatographic conditions to be selected as per earlier review literature like stationary phase, mobile phase composition, pH & flow rate of mobile phase and detection wavelength. Further also discussed troubleshooting in HPLC like how to avoid chocking of column, how to care for parts of HPLC and prevention of hurdles while operating HPLC system. She shared her experience for HPLC system maintenance and care with students and faculties.

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
