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### INTRODUCTION

**NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME** popularly known as **NSS** was launched in Gandhi's Birth Centenary Year 1969, under the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports Govt. of India with primary focus on the development of personality of students through community service and promotion of National solidarity.

NSS works on the premise that it is possible to awaken the villagers and slum dwellers to their responsibilities and develop in them the confidence, to tackle their common problems with energy, enthusiasm and in a co-operative spirit, based on mutual aid and self-reliance. The role of students is limited as activists, enablers, catalytic agents with wider communities and as programme aids.

### Symbol of N.S.S (National Service Scheme)

The symbol for the NSS has been based on the giant Rath Wheel of the world-famous Konark Sun Temple (The Black Pagoda) situated in Odisha, India. The wheel portrays the cycle of creation, preservation and release. It signifies the movement in life across time and space, the symbol thus stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social change. The eight bars in the wheel represents 24 hours of a day. The red colour indicates that the volunteer is full of young blood that is lively, active, energetic and full of high spirit. The navy blue colour indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is tiny part, ready to contribute its share for the welfare of the mankind. It stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS.

- Understand themselves in relation to their community.
- ➤ Identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in problem-solving.
- Develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility.

- > Develop competence required for group-living and sharing of responsibilities.
- ➤ Gain skills in mobilizing community participation.
- Acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitudes.
- ➤ Develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters and Practice national integration and social harmony.

# DAY BY DAY WORK

## • FIRST DAY OF CAMP:

- The camp was started with an oath ceremony. On first day a drawing competition was arranged for students of Bhagod Govt. School. Students were encouraged with a small toucon of prizes.
- A English teaching lecture was organised for students of bhagod village in order to make them educated about simple basic English language.

## • SECOND DAY OF CAMP:

- On second day, a Trekking camp was organised for NSS volunteers. Around 26 volunteers and 4 faculty have joined this trekking. The trekk was started from 7 am in morning. Students were made aware about environment, save soil on their route on different sight seeing.
- Trekking was concluded with small breakfast arrangement by 11 am.





## • THIRD DAY OF CAMP:

- Total 20 tree sampling were done in different areas of bhagod village. A small kit of Stationery essentials distribution were done to students of bhagod village.
- Students and villager were gathered in large amount and was given different information for save soil. Different techniques, points which can affect the soil, precautions which are to be taken for save soil.
- Students were also given poster competition on save soil awareness and top 3 students were rewarded with small gifts.





### • FOURTH DAY OF CAMP:

- A yoga session was kept in morning for students and villagers. Different activity were performed like suryanamskar, breathing excerise.
- The session was concluded with chanting of Om.
- In afternoon, a session was kept for sanitary pads and hygiene. Girls and ladies of village were given importance to use sanitary pads. How to keep hygiene to avoid any infection or communicable disease.
- The areas of bhagod village were cleaned up by NSS Volunteers.





# • FIFTH DAY OF CAMP:

- Ancient games were played with villagers and students.
- The top scorer were rewarded with small gift.
- In afternoon, a cloth distribution which was collected by NSS cell with help of students and faculty of colleges were distributed to Bhagod Village.





# • SIXTH DAY OF CAMP:

- A lunch was organised for people of Bhagod village and the ceremony was closed with a national anthem.
- Sweater distribution was done to students of bhagod Govt school.
